- Different funding procedures national funding procedures apply.


Agreement on common topics, calendar and procedures to implement a joint call - need to collect information on the national/regional funding programmes of the participating countries and regions


The launch of a joint call is the result of the **coordination of the national and regional research funding programmes** across Europe and globally.

21 partners from 15 EU Member-States + Argentina + South Africa Main results:





#### **ERA-MIN 2 (1st December 2016 – 30th November 2021) – 5 years**


- **Title:** Implement a European-wide **coordination of research & innovation programs** on raw materials to strengthen the industry competitiveness and the shift to a circular economy
- Horizon 2020 ERA-NET Cofund
  - Eligible participants are research funding organisations (national Ministries, regional authorities, national and regional funding agencies).
  - The European Commission co-funds a single joint call for transnational proposals (ERA-MIN Joint Call 2017). I
  - In addition, two joint calls without EU co-funding will be implemented.

Participation of legal entities from international countries and/or regions is encouraged in the joint calls.

- EU co-funding: ca. **5 M€**
- Total call budget ca. 15 M€
- Launch: 1st February 2017
- Centralised peer-review based on the H2020 evaluation criteria: 1) Excellence, 2) Impact and 3) Implementation.
- Selection of projects following a ranking list recommended by the Scientific Evaluation Board.
- Funding decision: 15<sup>th</sup> Jan. 2018
- Projects start: 1<sup>st</sup> May 2018



As a result of 3 joint calls for transnational R&I proposals, ERA-MIN 2 aims to provide support to a total of **30 transnational R&I projects with 30 million Euros.**

#### **ERA-MIN 2 JOINT CALL 2017**



- ❖ Joint application & evaluation but **national/regional funding** + co-fund from European Commission.
- ❖ National/regional funding priorities, rules and regulations apply:
  - Call topics (and sub-topics) eligible for funding
  - Eligible organisations from academia, industry, SMEs, NGOs, public authorities from the participating countries/regions
  - Eligible type of research: fundamental and applied research (Technology Readiness Level TRL 1-9)

Not all topics, organisations and type of research are supported by all funding organisations









#### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – ERA MIN 2 2017 JOINT CALL AS AN EXAMPLE



This joint call process was developed **based on the experiences of other ERA-NETs** (SEAS-ERA, OCEANERA-NET, M-ERA.NET, ERA-MIN) and the **ERA-LEARN toolbox** 



#### **SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – ADMINISTRATION BODIES**



## Joint Call Committee (JCC)

Who? Composed only by the funding organisations contributing financially with national or regional funds to the Joint Call

Role? Supervises the whole Call procedure and agrees on the final list of proposals recommended for funding.

#### **Scientific Evaluation Panel (SEP)**

Who? Composed of independent international recognised scientific experts appointed by the funding organisations

Role? Peer-review the proposals submitted to the Joint Call. SEP members will not submit or participate in proposals within this Call and must sign declarations of confidentiality and of conflict of interest.

## Joint Call Secretariat (JCS)

**Who?** Composed by 2-5 representatives of the funding organisations, with the main task of implementing the Joint Call and the follow-up phase until the funded projects and all reporting requirements have ended.

**Role?** Collects all submitted proposals, makes them available to the JCC and to the reviewers of the Scientific Evaluation Board (SEP). Handles the communication with the applicants, the reviewers, the JCC and the beneficiaries of funded projects.

#### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – STEPS BEFORE LAUNCHING THE CALL



#### ❖ 5-6 months before the launch of the call

Questionnaire directed to the funding organisations interested in joining the call addressing all the questions needed to design a call timeline, to define the scope of the call, the type of funded projects, project duration, the call procedures, etc.

❖ 4 months before the launch of the call – Establishment of the call procedures and rules and call topics

First Joint Call Committee (JCC) meeting to decide on the call procedures, timeline and topics and discuss the draft call documents and outline a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) or Letter of Commitment.

❖ 2 months before the launch of the call – Agreement of call documents and promotion activities

**Second Joint Call Committee (JCC) meeting** with the aim to agree on the call topics, **consolidate and sign off the internal and public call documents**, agree on a timeline, become aware of the main contents of the electronic submission and evaluation system under development and decide on **call promotion activities** (call pre-announcement leaflet).

TRL 8 – system complete and qualified

TRL 9 – actual system proven in operational environment

Each proposal indicates the TRL position in the beginning of the project and after the project is finished

#### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – FUNDING MODEL



## Virtual common pot:

- Each funding organisation pays for the eligible organisations from its country or region (no cross-border funding);
- Gaps in the ranking list can occur when a country/region exhausts the committed funds and the transnational project may not be funded.

## Mixed mode (option for EU Co-funded calls)

- Standard model for EU co-funded calls in ERA-NET Cofund:
- Each funding organisation supports only the eligible organisations from their country or region (virtual common pot);
- The EU contribution can support any organisation when the national/regional funds are exhausted (real common pot);
- The EU contribution is used to overcome gaps in the ranking list thus allowing the funding of a higher number of projects

#### **INFORM CALL DOCUMENTS:**

For each joint call for proposals, these call documents must be customised and updated to include the requirements of the funding organisations involved in a specific joint call.

#### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – Example of a Memorandum of Understanding





The ERA-MIN 2015 Call Funding Partners:

#### "Name of funding orgaisation", XXXX

Hereby commit to participate in the third ERA-MIN Joint Call on Sustainable Supply of Raw Materials in Europe (2015), as follows:

(1) We agree to follow the process described in the **Call text and Call procedures**, annex of the present Memorandum, which is the framework Call document and includes:

the Call topics;

the eligibility criteria;

the Call procedures;

the Call calendar;

the project proposal form;

the evaluation criteria and scoring;

the conditions for joint monitoring of funded projects.

- (2) We will undertake all measures to secure budget availability for project funding according to the signed letter of financial commitment. The final funding decisions will be made according to national procedures and regulations. (\*)
- (3) We will keep confidential all information related to the projects and not use them for any other purpose than for the evaluation of the application, making a funding decision and monitoring of the project, according to the provisions of the Call documents.

- Pre-proposal must to be submitted electronically by the coordinator via the ERA-MIN
   ESS on the deadline.
- Eligible consortium: two independent legal entities from two different EU Member States countries/regions or EU Associated Country participating in this Call
- Consortia with entities from Argentina, Brazil, Chile or South Africa must have 3 legal entities
- Each applicant requesting funding must comply with the national/regional funding criteria and regulations of their respective funding organisation to ensure the eligibility of the consortium proposal
- All fields of the pre-proposal technical descriptions must be filled in and the total length of the technical description cannot exceed a maximum of 6 pages for preproposal, excluding the financial plan, references and annexes;

### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – CALL DOCUMENTS: Guidelines to applicants (6)





#### **Recommendations to applicants:**

- ❖ The applicants must liaise with the **local contact person of their country/region** and confirm that the national/regional priorities, funding criteria and regulations are met.
- ❖ One (and only one) coordinator, represented by a lead researcher, has to be nominated among the partners to represent the consortium.
- ❖ The proposal should clearly **identify the specific contribution of each partner** in the consortium and the added value of working together.
- More than two partners from more than two countries forming a consortium are encouraged to apply.
- The involvement of applicants from the **third countries** participating in the Call, namely, Argentina, Brazil, Chile and South Africa) is **highly desirable**.
- ❖ The consortium size should be suitable for the level and complexity of the project and each partner should have a significant contribution for the transnational added value of collaboration.
- Consortium range between 2 and 7 partners from 2 to 7 countries (indicative)

#### SETTING UP A JOINT CALL – CALL DOCUMENTS: Guidelines to applicants (7)





#### **Recommendations to applicants (cont.):**

- ❖ Applicants requesting funding have to make sure that their proposal fulfils the Call eligibility criteria, as well as the national/regional eligibility criteria.
- ❖ Partnerships **academia-industry** are particularly encouraged to apply. Other types of consortia (e.g. purely industrial or academic) may also apply.
- Large, medium and small-size companies are particularly encouraged to apply.
- ❖ A proposal may cover more than one of the sub-topics. Not all topics and sub-topics are supported by all participating funding organisations.
- In terms of total funding, expected size of a proposal in the range of 0.3 to 1.5 million Euro.
- ❖ The coordinator should register in advance in the ERA-MIN Electronic Proposal Submission System (<a href="http://www.submission-era-min.eu/">http://www.submission-era-min.eu/</a>)
- ❖ In order to find potential partners to build a consortium, a web-based partner search tool has been set up at the NCPs-CaRE website (http://partnersearch.ncpscare.eu/).





- ❖ Before the launch of the call, a **Call pre-announcement leaflet** (pdf) with the countries that have confirmed their participation is produced and the call is disseminated at national and international events.
- ❖ A Brokerage workshop is organized with registration free of charge and companies profiles and project ideas are collected and disseminated at the workshop.
- ❖ A **Webinar** is organised before, or after, the launch of the call to present the Joint Call topics and procedures to all the interested parties.
- ❖ On the launch of the call, a **call announcement leaflet** (pdf) is produced and uploaded at the ERA-NET website and a specific new is created.
- ❖ All the **public call documents** and the **Electronic Submission System** are made available on the launch of the joint call at the ERA-NET website.


