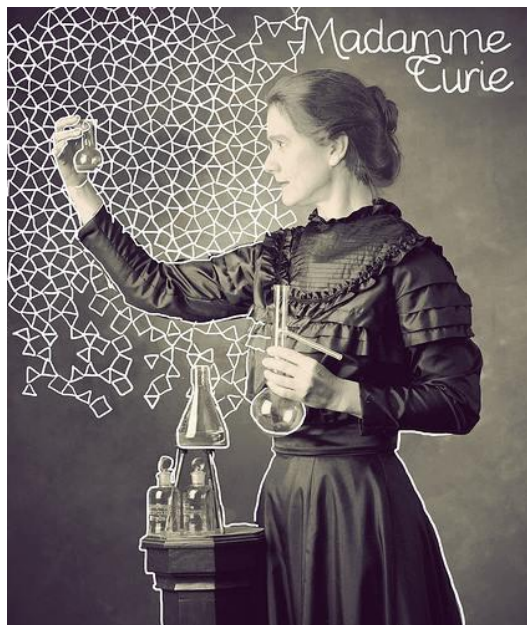

Innovation

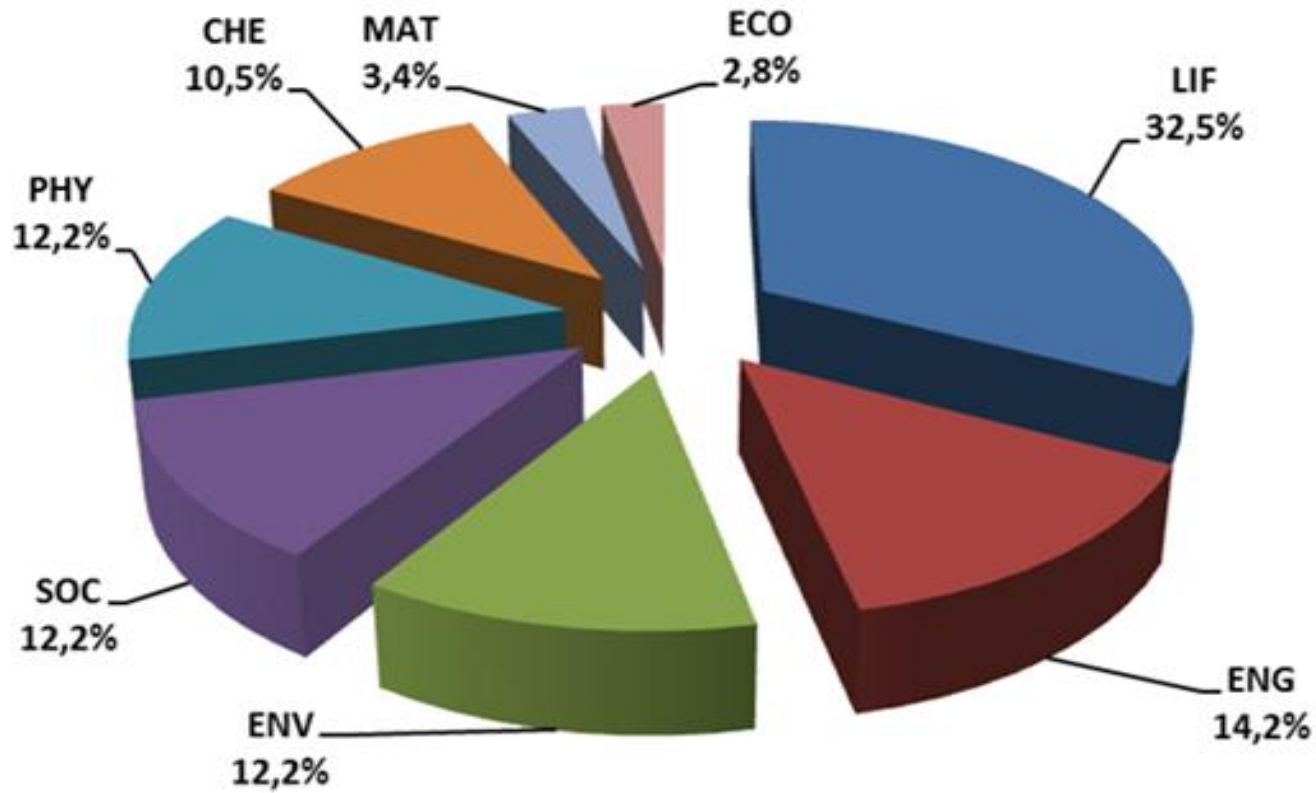

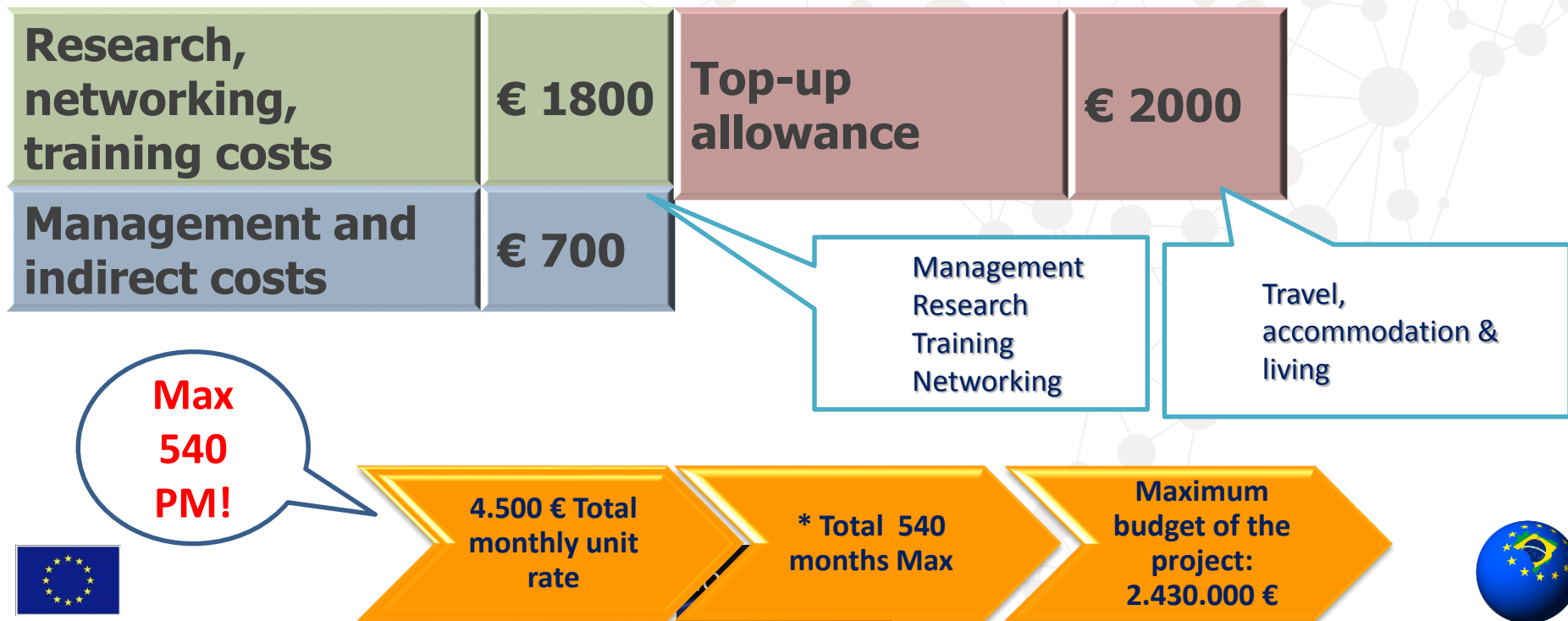


RISE – Financial Dimension

In exchanges with industrialised countries & emerging economies – i.e. Brazil,
EU funding is **only*** for staff of the **European partners**
i.e. those going out of Europe

*unusual exceptions: when a partner in an industrialised or emerging country is deemed essential to the project

Unit costs for each month of mobility




- Participation is open
- New H2020 rules– Brazil, as other emerging economies, is no longer eligible to receive automatic funding under H2020
- CONFAP/FAPs: *“Guidelines for the preparation of research proposals in collaboration with proposals submitted to EU Horizon 2020”*
 - Scope: finance the Brazilian participation in H2020 projects
 - In practice, the **Guidelines can be considered like a parallel call launched by FAPs** for the submission of research and innovation proposals in coordination with Horizon 2020 – **including MSCA RISE proposals**

1. Available local programs/funds that could provide support to Brazilian Horizon 2020 participants

Horizon 2020 is open to participation from across the world. European researchers can include partners from any other countries when preparing H2020 proposals. This means that Brazilian researchers, enterprises and institutions can team up with European partners to develop together knowledge, research data and leading scientific teams and networks.

Not all international partners are automatically eligible for funding by Horizon 2020. While the European Union will fund the participation of partners from developing countries, it does not automatically fund the partners from industrialised countries such as Brazil.

Brazilian participants themselves determine the sources of funding and resources for their part of the project: these may be own funds of the participating institutions, as well as funds received from Brazilian ministries, foundations and other research organisations in Brazil. Contributions can also be made in kind.

Potential Brazilian participants are therefore always encouraged to contact relevant research and innovation funding bodies and organisations such as the State Foundation for Research Support (FAPES), National Research Council (CNPq), Ministry of Science Technology and Innovation (MCTI) to seek funding for their participation in Horizon 2020.

Existing local co-funding mechanisms in Brazil

Different funding schemes for allowing Brazilian researchers to take part into Horizon 2020 are being set up in different Brazilian states through the existing Research Foundations in each Brazilian State. The first scheme was established by the Research Foundation of the State of São Paulo (FAPESP) in 2015. Following this, the National Council of Research Foundations (CONFAP, which previously signed an agreement with the EU Delegation to Brazil) has led a coordinated effort among the other research foundations in Brazilian States to follow the example of FAPESP. As a result, co-funding schemes for Brazilian researchers are available in the following states:

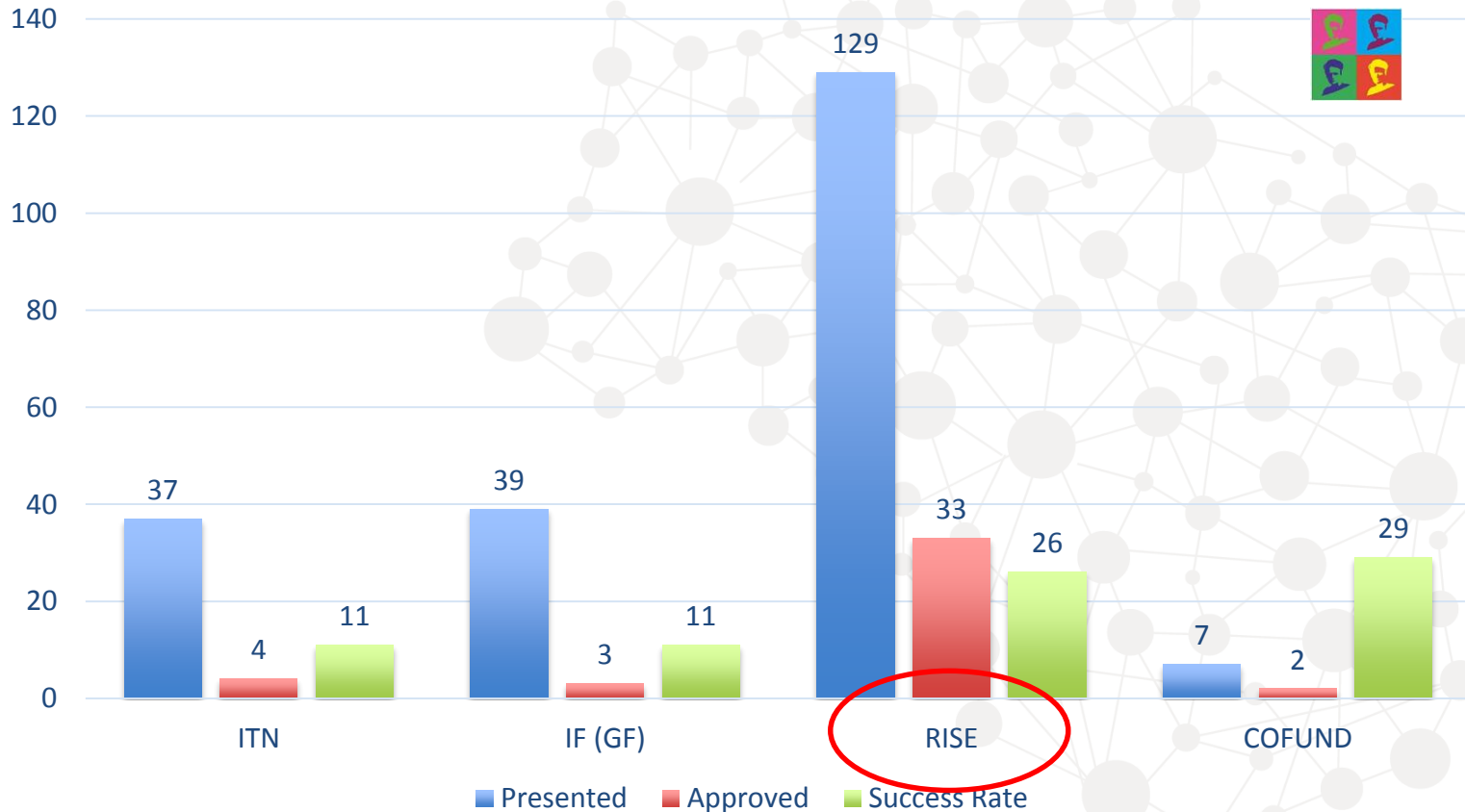

National Contact Points

Network of National Contact Points (NCPs)

The network of National Contact Points (NCPs) is the main structure to provide guidance, practical information and assistance on all aspects of participation in Horizon 2020.

What is the NCP network?

NCPs are national structures established and financed by governments of the 28 EU member states and the states associated to the framework programme. NCPs give personalised support on the spot and in applicants' own languages. The NCP systems can vary from one country to another from highly centralised to decentralised networks, and a number of very different actors, from ministries to universities, research centres and special agencies to private consulting companies.

NCPs are also established in many non-EU and non-associated countries ("third countries").

NCP Services

As the NCPs are national structures, the type and level of services offered may differ from country to country. In general, the following basic services are available in accordance with the NCP Guiding Principles agreed by all countries:

- Guidance on choosing relevant H2020 topics and types of action
- Advice on administrative procedures and contractual issues
- Training and assistance on proposal writing
- Distribution of documentation (forms, guidelines, manuals etc.)
- Assistance in partner search

Search for your NCP

Find the contact details of your national H2020 National Contact Point or those of your potential partner's country. You can search for NCPs in Member States, Associated Countries and third countries. You can also search for NCPs by thematic areas or functions; for instance, you can look for an NCP who is specialised in Marie Curie actions.
